

IUNS workshop on Capacity and Leadership Development in Nutritional Sciences





The International Union of Nutritional Sciences (IUNS) has organized Nutrition Leadership Training programs in various regions after Capacity Building guidelines were developed by IUNS and United Nations University (UNU) in 1996. Following the previous IUNS workshop on Capacity and Leadership Development in Nutritional Sciences organized in 2010, the next regional Nutrition Leadership Training program will be held in Japan in March 2014.

The UN high-level meeting on non-communicable diseases (NCDs) held in 2011, where governmental representatives (e.g. former ministers), private institutions and the World Health Organization (WHO) assembled, declared NCD as one of the prioritized global health issues. Following this declaration, the specific goals to be achieved by the year 2025 were set, and each country has been working on the NCDs prevention and control strategy. Concurrently, WHO set the "Global Targets 2025: To improve maternal, infant and young child nutrition", including "40% reduction in the number of children under-5 who are stunted" and "30% reduction in low birth weight". As mentioned above, the coexistence of overnutrition leading to NCDs and undernutrition in the same country or community has become the most significant nutritional problem, so-called "double burden of malnutrition".

The principal aim of the upcoming workshop is that the participants from Japan as well as other Asian countries will share their experiences and acquire the necessary knowledge and skills for leadership development toward the solution of the above global health and nutrition issues.
